Steve opened the Meeting at 6:35 P.M. and volunteered to take Minutes in Mike's absence. The April Minutes were reviewed. Ellen made a motion to approve the April Minutes as written, Rich seconded the motion, and they were approved unanimously (3-0). The May Minutes, which were taken by Mike, are still outstanding (there was no meeting in June).

Steve presented the Committee with the Off-Hours Reports for May and June.

Steve went over the status of the trash contract renewal. As much of the process as possible has been done in public. The Selectmen Boards will have to consider the final proposal from Waste Management, Inc. in private, with a recommendation from Steve and Neal. If they accept the proposal they can make it public, if not, it will have to remain confidential until after a bidding process is completed. The 2010 contract, the 2015 WMI proposal, and the 2015 Towns' counter-proposal were reviewed.

Steve informed the committee that he will offer tours regularly starting in September. He will do this on any Saturday morning that he is available and all Board and Committee members will be notified. Members of the public will also be welcome.

Ellen brought up the recycling Committee under other business. She wondered what they were currently working on. Steve said that the RC has several new members and that he is answering questions for them. Steve and/or Rich may be going to their next meeting and will report back. Frank brought up that a couple of people were talking about Single stream again and wanted to know the financial impact of such a change. Steve said that to change the transfer station recycling center into single stream recycling would be easy and would have a net negative impact of between \$100,000 and \$120,000. Rich added that the proposed curbside program with single stream recycling is estimated to cost about \$600,000 per year.

Ellen made a motion to adjourn at 7:25 P.M., Rick seconded it, and the motion was passed 3-0.
