



## TOWN OF HOPKINTON, NEW HAMPSHIRE

### War Memorial Policy

POLICY NO. 37

#### **Section 1. Purpose**

War Memorials are placed in Town to honor those from the Town that have served their country during war time. The objective of this policy is to assure that there are clear, equitable guidelines for placing names on the monuments.

#### **Section 2. Placement of Memorials**

Any memorial to be placed on Town property shall have the advance approval of the Board of Selectmen who shall approve style, composition and placement. If the memorial is to be placed in the Hopkinton Village Precinct, the Precinct shall be notified in advance of the placement of the memorial.

#### **Section 3. Names to be on the Memorial**

The following criteria must be met in order for a name to be placed on the memorial:

- a. Must have been a Hopkinton resident during the time of military service.
- b. Must have served not less than 90 days in the armed forces of the United States in any qualifying war or armed conflict and was honorably discharged or an officer honorably separated from service.

#### **Section 4. Addition of Names to Existing Memorials**

Should the Town determine that names of those meeting the criteria in this policy have been left off the existing memorials, the Town at its expense will assure that the names are added.
