

**Hopkinton Zoning Board of Adjustment  
Notice of Decision  
January 5, 2010**

Notice is hereby given that the Hopkinton Zoning Board of Adjustment held a hearing on Tuesday, January 5, 2010, at 7:00 PM in the Town Hall. During the hearing, the Board made the following decisions:

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**I. Applications.**

Case #: ZO2009-1: NH Sheep & Wool Growers Association Request for a SPECIAL USE PERMIT for use of the Hopkinton Fair Grounds on May 8th and 9th to hold the 34th Annual Sheep & Wool Festival. The property is located off Kearsarge Avenue, shown on Tax Map Lot: 222-60.

Daniel Rinden, seconded by Harold Perkins, moved to vote on the application as presented. Motion carried unanimously. With four members voting, all four voted in favor (Gray, Perkins, Rinden and McLeod). The Applicant adequately addressed the standards set forth in paragraph 3.8.6 which included addressing the criteria for a Special Exception set forth in paragraph 15.8.2 of the Zoning Ordinance.

**II. Review of the Minutes and Notice of Decision of November 3, 2009.**

Toni Gray, seconded by Harold Perkins, moved approval of the November 3, 2009 Minutes with grammatical corrections. Motion carried unanimously.

Harold Perkins, seconded by Gregory McLeod, moved approval of the November 3, 2009, Notice of Decision as presented. Motion carried unanimously.

Such a request must set forth the grounds on which it is claimed the decision is unlawful or unreasonable. The Board must decide to grant or deny the rehearing within thirty (30) days.
