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CONTOOCOOK VILLAGE PRECINCT COMMISSIONERS PUBLIC MEETING MINUTES FEBRUARY 5, 2019 – 6:00 PM SLUSSER CENTER

I. CALL TO ORDER

- e. Discussion ensued regarding generator testing. Tom will work on having Zack get the Commissioners all set up.
