Advertising and fundraising will need to be coordinated between the two groups.

The bartender for the Murder Mystery Dinner contacted Paula to inform her that Sept. 17<sup>th</sup> is already booked. Most Saturdays are booked now for weddings. She is available to do it Thursday, Friday or Sunday. It was decided to continue looking for a bartender that is available for Sept. 17<sup>th</sup>. Several committee members stated they will help with this search.

The annual Easter Egg Hunt is April 9<sup>th</sup>. If the weather permits it will be held outdoors at the Harold Martin School. The bunny will arrive at 9:30 a.m. and the hunt will begin around 10:00 a.m. If the forecast predicts rain, an alternative location will be considered.

Mark has reached out to several groups about participating in a multi-diversity type event and there has been some support. He will continue the discussions and report back to the committee as things progress.
