What is Community Power?

New Hampshire cities, towns, and counties can become **default electricity provider** for their residents + businesses and provide related services.


RSA 53-E, Relative to Aggregation of Electric Customers by Municipalities & Counties

Electricity Choices

- Energy customers can select from a menu of energy choices.
- ✓ Customers are always free to choose to buy power from their utility, or from another market option, without charge.



What are the key steps to establish Hopkinton Community Power?

- Select Board appoints Community Power Committee (CPC) DONE
- ❖ Register with PUC DONE
- Get account and load data from utilities UNDERWAY
- ❖ CPC develops electric aggregation plan PLANNED FALL 2023/EARLY WINTER 2024
- CPC convenes at least two public hearings PLANNED LATE FALL 2023/EARLY WINTER 2024
- Place the Community Power warrant article on the ballot for Town Meeting PLANNED MARCH 2024
- Select energy broker/power supplier PLANNED SPRING 2024
- Submit final Electric Aggregation Plan to the Public Utilities Commission for review and approval – PLANNED WINTER/SPRING 2024
- Launch SUMMER 2024

Customer Notification and Enrollment Process

- At least 30 days before program launch all electric customers will be mailed notifications including the initial fixed rate for Community Power service compared with Eversource/Unitil
- Customers on Eversource/Unitil default energy service able to decline participation or "opt-out"
- ✓ If a customer is already getting their power from a competitive supplier, nothing will change unless they choose to "opt-in" to Community Power.
- ➤ Eversource/Unitil will continue to deliver electricity using their poles and wires, provide billing services, and ensure reliability.
- ✓ Rates posted at least 30 days in advance; customers can switch supplier at next meter read upon request with no penalty or exit fee.
- Community Power is self-funded by rates paid by participating customers. No taxes will be used to cover program expenses.



Selecting a Community Power Partner

- Two models: private broker, nonprofit power agency
- We considered:
 - Rate history
 - Rate stability & flexibility
 - Termination provisions
 - Services & assistance provided
 - Governance & transparency
 - Overall community benefit
- Met with and did reference checks on two entities
- Recommending we partner with CPCNH on program development



Community Benefit: Savings + Reserves

- ✓ Community Power creates savings, rate stability, value for customers by developing beneficial local energy projects and programs
- >\$20 Million in value in CPCNH's first year (Apr Dec 2023):
 - ~\$10 Million in immediate customer bill savings
 - ~\$10 Million in community reserves for long-term benefit

CPCNH sets rates with the objective of saving you money and offering at least one supply option at a discount relative to your utility supply rate (along with 'opt up' choices). Most utility rates are set from February 1 to July 31, 2023. Our default rates will change for the next utility rate period, scheduled from August 1, 2023 through January 31, 2024.





6 Month Cycle Weighted Avg Utility Rates




Broker 3-Year ~3% Discount to Utility Rate (Steady State Load Weighted)

- 6 Month Cycle Weighted Avg Utility Rates
- Broker 3-Year ~3% Discount to Utility Rate (Steady State Load Weighted)
- -- CPCNH 15.8¢ to 5% Base Case Discount to Utility Rate Forecast
- -- CPCNH Base Case Discount + Community Net Income Contribtion to Reserves Per MWh (annual hedging strategy)

CPCNH Implementation Process Steps

Join the Coalition → Bring a Plan to Town Meeting → Launch!

- □ 1. Join Coalition "Joint Powers Agency" Governed by Members
 - Membership by Select Board vote to adopt Joint Powers Agreement (JPA)
 - JPA is the contract among Members & By-laws
- □ 2. Establish an "Electric Aggregation Committee" (EAC) to;
 - Prepare an "Electric Aggregation Plan" (EAP);
 - Hold two public hearings on that EAP in advance of;
 - Bringing the EAP to Town Meeting for voter adoption;
- □ 3. Launch Community Power!
 - □ Town Meeting adoption of an EAP authorizes (but does not require) the Select Board to contract for services to finance, launch, and operate Community Power.

Joint Powers Agreement (JPA)

- ✓ JPA is a contract among municipal and county members establishing the Agency
 - Financial liabilities & obligations of Agency are "firewalled" from municipal general funds
- ✓ Includes Articles of Agreement and By-Laws (purpose & structure; voting rights; Director & Officer elections; provisions of cost sharing; oversight committees; financial & operational risk management compliance audits; limitations of liability; insurance; etc.)
 - 20 Board Directors elected by the Membership (1 vote per Member city/town)
 - One Director, One Vote" on the Board of Directors
- Adopting JPA and joining CPCNH provides access to expertise and resources at no cost
 - No "hard" commitment until Cost Sharing Agreement + Energy Risk Management, Rates & Reserves policies are subsequently approved by governing body (which authorizes CPCNH to procure supply)
- Process: vote of governing body approves the JPA for execution & designates Member Representative & Alternate → and then CPCNH Board votes to approve community as a new Member

Recommendation

The Hopkinton Community Power Committee recommends that the Hopkinton Select Board vote to adopt the CPCNH Joint Powers Agreement
