CALL TO ORDER

The Board reviewed the Select Board Meeting Minutes of Monday, November 16, 2020. Chair Dunlap had one change to the adjournment time to reflect 11:06 pm. Mr. Traum made a motion to approve the Select Board Minutes of November 16, 2020, with the change in time. Chair Dunlap seconded the motion.

POINTS OF PRIDE: Mr. Traum noted that the Hopkinton Rotary Club gifted Fire Chief Yale with a ventilator for use in the ambulances. This gift was made possible a donation. Mr. Traum thanked the Rotary Club for their donation.

APPOINTMENT: Deer Meadow Solar Update:

Dominic LeBel, Michael Caplan, Ben Chamberlain, and Andrew Provencher from Olivewood Energy. Mr. LeBel gave an overview of the project since the original approval from both Webster and Hopkinton at the 2019 Town Meeting. He noted it is a proposed 75 MW-AC solar farm located on and near the Hopkinton/Webster landfill, but not on the landfill cap. He further noted that Olivewood Energy would work closely to with both Towns, to develop a Memorandum of Understanding (MOU), creating binding obligations for the project. He further noted that the permit application would be to the NH Site Evaluation Committee (SEC).

Mr. LeBel gave a site overview of where the solar panels would be located. He also went over the principal design criteria, an overview of the SEC process and a broader development schedule.

Mr. Traum thanked them for their presentation, noting that he and Mr. Whitley have seen the presentation previously. Mr. Traum noted that the lease dollar amount has not changed. He also inquired about a revision. Mr. LeBel noted that a reference was incorrect and so the revision was to correct that reference.

Chair Dunlap thanked Mr. LeBel and his colleagues and thanked Mr. Traum and Mr. Whitley for their work on this project.

MASK ORDINANCE:

Mr. Traum suggested that we table the discussion on the mask ordinance as the Governor has mandated a state-wide mask ordinance. Discussion ensued with regard to reasons why we should move forward with the ordinance and reasons why we do not need to move forward at this time with the ordinance, the expiration date of the Governor's order, exceptions that are not in our draft and being proactive not reactive. By consensus of the Board, the Public Hearing, scheduled for Monday, November 30, 2020 has been cancelled.

BUDGET DISCUSSION AND WORK:

Budget discussions ensued, with regard to possible changes, fund balance amount, possible revenue changes, George Park Irrigation, Houston Barn roof, merit wage pool, healthcare employee %, Bates Building rent, and a proposed hike increase for sewer users. The Board agreed to make the following changes:

The Board also agreed to increase valuation by 1%.

Chair Dunlap thanked Mr. Traum and Mr. Cass for their work on the budget.

PUBLIC COMMENT:

Steve Lux thanked the Board for tonight's meeting. With regard to the proposed Chesley land purchase, Mr. Lux commented that the Board should be sure that the value placed on the land the town is looking to purchase, as a way to make a profit by avoiding the current use penalty. He stated the current owner has had the benefit of current use for many years. He hoped the Hopkinton community does not have to bear the burden of the tax savings.

ADJOURNMENT

There being no further business, Mr. Donohoe made a motion to adjourn, seconded by Mr. Traum. The meeting adjourned at 8:26 p.m.
